



PORPOISE PRATTLE — The lawsuit brought against Seaworld and the Department of Commerce by the State of Washington in March of this year was dropped in a compromise between the parties with the primary result that the heroes of the episode were placed in a position of not being able to demand and receive satisfaction. IAAAM NEWS thinks they should have it!

The heroes of the suit were the Secretary of Commerce and his representatives who have faithfully, diligently, and competently executed the provisions of the Marine Mammal Protection Act since its passage in December, 1972, the president of Seaworld, Inc. and his representatives, who have expertly adhered to provisions of their permit to capture killer whales, and the head of the Washington State Game Department whose men have conscientiously enforced regulations implementing provisions of the Act under contract to the Department of Commerce.
